Reporting Littering

What is Litter?

Litter is classed as any waste less than 200 litres in volume that is disposed of inappropriately.

Litter includes anything such as an apple core, cigarette butt, drink container or takeaway bag.

Littering is serious, unhealthy, unsightly and unsafe.

Let's keep our roadsides clean and prevent this litter from polluting our creeks, rivers and farmlands. Litter may cause a danger to plants, livestock or animal life. Litter can also potentially spread weed species or be a fire risk.

You can make a difference

There's two simple ways you can help reduce litter on Queensland roads.

1. Keep your rubbish in your vehicle until you can dispose of it appropriately in a bin.
2. Report littering offences you witness to the Department of Environment and Heritage Protection.

Littering is an offence and the department takes it seriously with fines starting at \$200 plus.

Doing the right thing is easy. You can report it as you see it occurring via your smart phone or tablet, upload photos instantly and pin the location of the incident through Google maps. Make sure you get as many details as you can, including:

- time, date, place and description of litter
- registration number, make/model, colours, or distinguishing features of vehicle
- description of the person making the offence (including location in vehicle, clothing, gender).

Please remember it is illegal to use your mobile phone while driving.

Under no circumstances approach the person depositing the waste.
